#### **STUDENT REPORTS**

Teachers are currently working on Semester 2 Reports. To ensure all parents receive their child's report in a timely manner, all Year 7-10 student reports will be posted home to parents by Wednesday, 18<sup>th</sup> December 2013.

#### **2014 SCHOOL YEAR**

Students return to school for 2014 on Wednesday, 29<sup>th</sup> January 2014 and all students are expected to attend on this day. If your child is intending to travel overseas or take an extended holiday beyond 29<sup>th</sup> January, parents/guardians **must** supply a note to the College before leaving which indicates the return date to school. Students should return these notes to their Home group teachers. Gleneagles is becoming a very popular destination for many families and we receive a number of enquiries for enrolments for 2014 every day. It is essential we know if you are intending to return to school any later than 29<sup>th</sup> January 2014 to retain your place at this College.

#### **UNCLEARED LOCKERS**

All students should ensure they clear their lockers by Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2013. #### **TERMITE DAMAGE IN E BLOCK**
